In front of you, right now, is something that has some sheets of paper on it. What is this thing with a flat surface on which the exam papers are placed? What is it called? Well, the answer is "desk", which is No. 2. OK? Let's begin.

Yesterday I found a huge insect flying around in my room. I really really hate insects, so at first I just screamed and ran out of the room! After that I went back and tried to hit it with a book. That didn't work, so I tried using a rolled-up newspaper. But the insect flew at me instead! I couldn't take any more, so I ended up running next door to my neighbour. He brought a net and came to help me, but he doesn't like insects either, so he wasn't a lot of help! Then my son came home and picked it up with a tissue and flushed it down the toilet. He made it look so simple!

Question: What was the insect finally caught with?

A rainbow is one of the most beautiful and natural phenomena in the sky. It appears when the sun's rays strike raindrops, as the Hawaiian proverb "No rain, no rainbow" says. We think it has seven colors: red, orange, yellow, green, blue, indigo, and violet, from outside to inside. But the truth is, ideas about the number of colors differ between countries. Sometimes you see a secondary rainbow outside the primary one. The color order of the secondary rainbow appears opposite. Yesterday, I happened to see a so-called "upside down rainbow." Although it looked like a rainbow, it was, in fact, not a rainbow. Unlike rainbows, where sunlight changes its direction through raindrops, in upside down rainbows the light changes through ice crystals in the clouds.
